HOLISTIC SUPPORT

Mental Health Services

CB's Mental Health Services team includes full-time mental health professionals who provide behavioral health interventions to help students manage academic pressures, form healthy relationships, and strengthen coping and resiliency skills. Ensuring robust mental health support can lead to better academic performance, enhanced well-being, and long-term success.

Student Stabilization Services

CB's Stabilization team is made up of trained social workers and mental health professionals who work to create conducive environments for students to focus on their education without the burden of unmet basic needs. In collaboration with our grade-level teams and therapists, stabilization staff work proactively and urgently to alleviate issues like homelessness, food insecurity, and unmet medical needs.

All In **WHAT WE DO**

TO & THROUGH

Our flagship model is a 7-9 year program. Students join the summer before 10th grade and remain with us through college graduation. This strong and long commitment is the core of the College Bound difference.

COLLEGE PREP

In 10th-12th grades, students:

- Focus on developing good study habits
- Sharpen academic tools through class and tutoring
- Receive individualized ACT prep
- Visit colleges of interest
- Attend career exploration events
- Select and apply for best-fit colleges

COLLEGE COMPLETION

Once in college, CB students receive one-on-one advising and assistance with:

- Debt management
- Course selection
- Career planning
- Networking opportunities

CB ON CAMPUS

We embrace the power of providing young adults with multiple pathways to college degrees and successful careers. Our CB on Campus programs support first-generation students at St. Louis Community College and Ranken Technical College.



FROM THE START

RECRUITMENT

We begin recruiting students in 9th grade - presenting in schools, staffing tables at community events, and spreading the word about our program. Once accepted, the recruitment team engages students through special events - allowing them to begin building community between staff, students, and families.

All In RELATIONSHIPS



10TH GRADE

In year one we dive into building strong bonds between peers and coaches. Students connect through classes, check-ins, networking events, and overnight camp! We focus on building college knowledge, getting a head start on planning, developing solid academic habits and study strategies, and taking time to explore students' identities and future aspirations.

CAMP

The star of the show during the fall is sophomore camp! In October of 2023, students spent a weekend at Sherwood Forest Camp in Lesterville, MO. Designed to help students bond with each other and their CB coaches, students challenged themselves on the ropes course, learned the basics of kayaking and canoeing, and flew through the trees on the zip line. For many students, overnight camp was a new experience and the joy felt by students and staff alike was palpable.

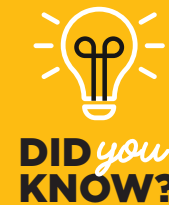


BUILDING FUTURES

EARNING COLLEGE CREDIT

Held on the campus of the University of Missouri-St. Louis (UMSL), Bayer Fund College Bound Summer Institute (CBSI) allows rising 11th graders the opportunity to earn transferable college credits for free.

Students are taught by UMSL faculty and granted access to on-campus student support services, all while getting to experience college-level coursework on an actual college campus. CB staff walk alongside them, debriefing classes, reviewing assignments, and helping navigate public transportation to get to class on time.



During the summer of 2023, CB students earned 69 transferable credits and saved nearly \$37,000 in tuition.

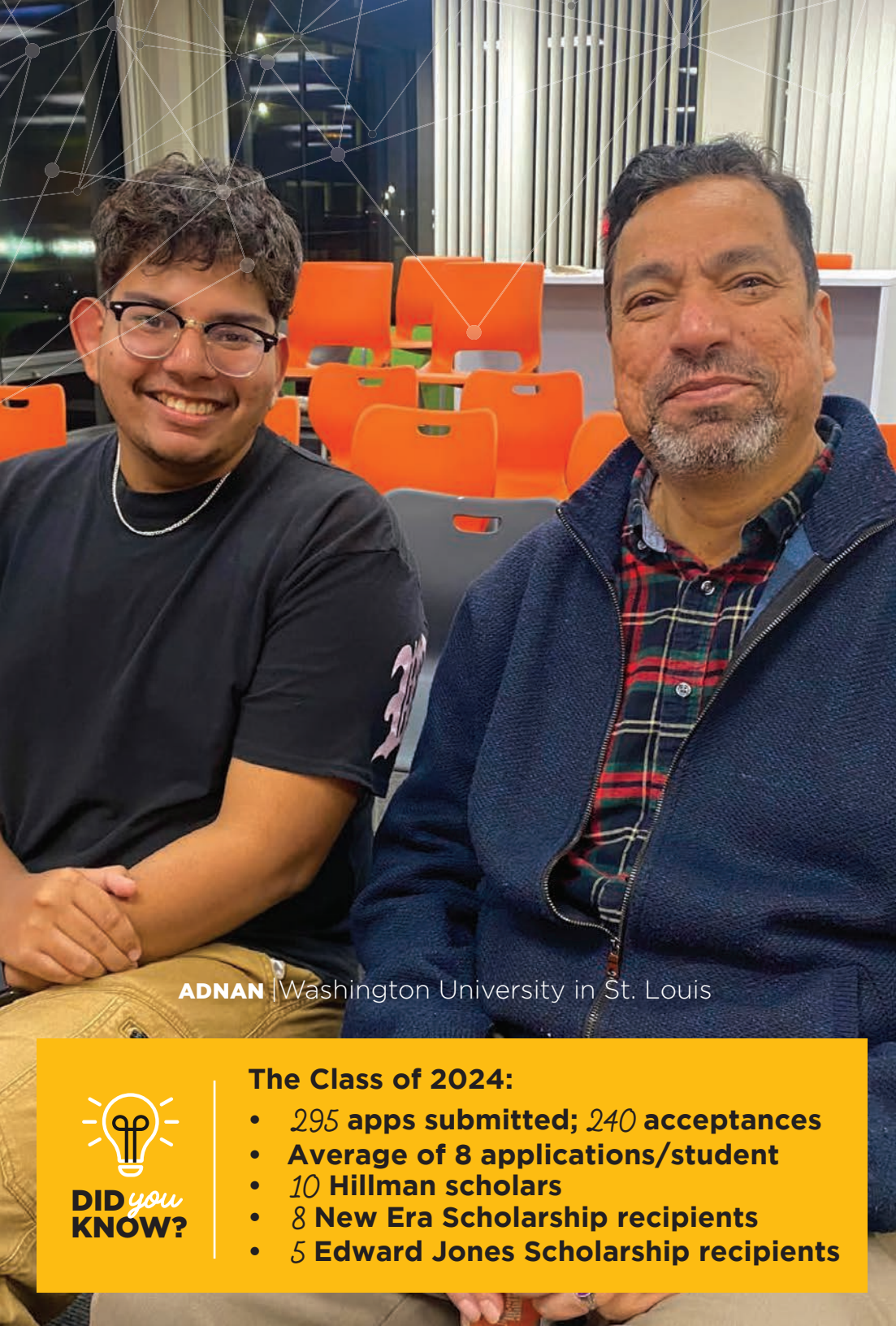
COLLEGE VISITS

All In **FOR APPLYING**

For first-generation students, the college application process can be particularly confusing. Without the guidance of family members familiar with the steps, it's difficult to navigate financial aid and confusing to sort through the associated jargon.

The support network at CB carefully guides students and families through the application process, helping them narrow down college lists, edit college essays, fill out FAFSA forms, and address financial gaps.

The recent changes to the FAFSA, though meant to simplify the process, introduced new challenges, uncertainties, and delays for students and their post-secondary plans. Despite the unprecedented challenges, our staff kept our families informed and equipped to stay on track.

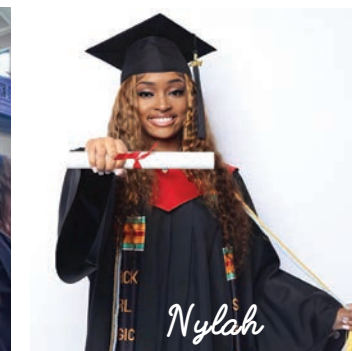
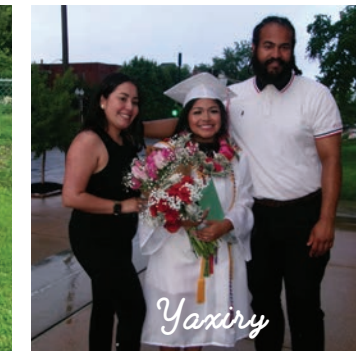

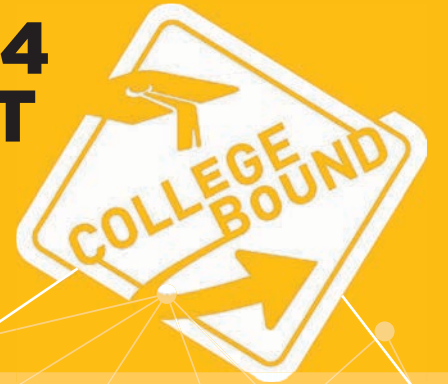

All In **FOR CB@STLCC**

In an effort to increase graduation rates for first-generation college students at St. Louis Community College, we established a program on the campus of STLCC-Forest Park in 2017. With an office on campus and a full-time staff devoted to serving the needs of students at STLCC, the program is stronger than ever. While many CB@STLCC students are using community college as a stepping stone to a bachelor's degree, others are working towards 2-year certificates or credentials.



**DID you
KNOW?**

- **Since we opened our office on campus, graduation rates for first-generation CB students have steadily increased - from single digits to 39.8%!**
- **The needs of our CB@STLCC students are similar to those of our To & Through students but their entry point is different; they join us during their 1st year.**
- **We piloted CB@STLCC in 2017 and our first students graduated in 2019!**
- **In 2024, 15 CB@STLCC students graduated; 7 transferred to 4-year universities and 8 entered the workforce.**
- **Our CB@STLCC team has grown 400% since 2017.**

All In **FOR CB@RANKEN**



Three years ago, based largely on the success of our program at STLCC and with the generous support of Enterprise Mobility Foundation, we piloted a program on the campus of Ranken Technical College. CB@Ranken offers a supportive on-campus community, academic skill building, personalized coaching, and connection to on-campus resources.



- **Since our pilot program began at Ranken, 79% of students have passed all of their technical courses and 41% have graduated.**
- **CB@Ranken students have multiple pathways to earn their technical degree with bachelor's, associate, and certificate program options.**
- **We piloted CB@Ranken in 2021 and our first student graduated in 2023!**
- **In 2024, 9 CB@Ranken students graduated.**
- **CB@Ranken has one full-time staff member, Kelly, a CB alum.**

For first-generation students from low-income backgrounds, financing a college education can lead to crushing debt that can impact future choices - from career paths to personal milestones. CB provides support and resources to students that empower them to pursue their education without the burden of overwhelming debt.

Of recent CB alums:

- **48% did not borrow money for college.**
- **The average debt for alums who did take out loans is \$15,366 - well below the national average of \$28,950.**
- **CB celebrated 27 graduates from 4-year institutions in 2024.**
